Results of ballot initiatives

California, Nevada and Massachusetts approved measures legalizing the recreational use of marijuana, while Florida, Arkansas and North Dakota voted to allow pot for medical purposes. Maine's initiative is being recounted. Regardless, marijuana is still a [DEA Schedule I](#) drug and is illegal for federal employees to use.
